MEDTECH OBTAINS 8.3 M€ FROM BPIFRANCE, IN THE CONTEXT OF A COLLABORATIVE FUNDING PROGRAM

Montpellier, France, June 2, 2014 – MEDTECH (Euronext, FR0010892950 - ROSA) a company specialized in designing, developing and marketing innovative surgical robots, has announced the signature of a funding agreement with Bpifrance for 8.3 million Euros. This is part of an « Industrial Strategic Innovation » program (ISI) uniting three industrial partners, whose leader is Medtech.

The other two partners are Spinevision, an innovative company specialized in designing and marketing implants for spine surgery and Stäubli, an international specialist in industrial robotics.

In the context of this agreement, Medtech has received a 5 million Euro subsidy over 5 years in the form of a grant and a redeemable advance.
